


PENNSYLVANIA VITICULTURE AREA

CUMBERLAND VALLEY



DEFINED BY PLACE, MADE WITH CARE

Set along the ancient curve of the Susquehanna River, the Cumberland Valley Pennsylvania Viticulture Area (PVA) forms a distinctive corner of the broader Cumberland Valley American Viticulture Area (AVA), which stretches across Washington County, Maryland, and north through Franklin and Cumberland counties in Pennsylvania.

Fertile limestone soils, rolling hills, and warm, dry harvest seasons create a landscape built for expressive, food-friendly wines. The river tempers extremes, offering cool nights that preserve acidity and elevate aromatics, while occasional fog and humidity call for attentive, sustainable farming. Growers meet these conditions with thoughtful canopy management and a commitment to vine balance, producing wines of clarity and nuance.

Shale-rich slopes and higher-elevation sites lend mineral texture and structure, qualities that shine in dry whites, rosés, and elegant reds. Riesling, Sauvignon Blanc, Grüner Veltliner, and Cabernet Franc all thrive here, contributing to a style marked by freshness, versatility, and quiet complexity reminiscent of Old World river valleys known for their wide range of successful grape varieties.

Visitors arrive for the scenery and leave with bottles that capture the character of the river valley: wines crafted through collaboration and care.
