


PENNSYLVANIA VITICULTURE AREA

SHORELINE VINEYARDS, TIMELESS WINES

Set along the southern edge of its namesake Great Lake, the Lake Erie Pennsylvania Viticulture Area (PVA) is a landscape shaped by generations of growers who have long understood the rhythm of this shoreline.

As part of the expansive, three-state Lake Erie American Viticulture Area (AVA), this region benefits from one of the most distinctive lake-moderated climates in the country. The lake provides a natural buffer that softens winter's extremes, extends the ripening season, and allows grapes to hang long into autumn with firmness, freshness, and clarity.

While Concord and other native grapes remain part of the region's agricultural backbone, today's winemakers are expanding the narrative. Cool-climate vinifera such as Riesling and Pinot Noir, along with hybrids designed for northern growing conditions, are finding new expression in the hands of growers who pair experience with innovation. Rosé and sparkling programs, fueled by vibrant acidity and clean fruit profiles, are emerging as some of the most exciting signatures of the area.

Across this shoreline, hospitality is rooted in heritage. Visitors come for sweeping water views and stay for wines that balance tradition with evolution, taking home bottles that celebrate both the region's sweet-wine legacy and its growing momentum toward crisp dry whites, refreshing rosés, and elegant cool-climate reds.
