

# LEHIGH VALLEY



## PRECISION IN EVERY VINTAGE

The Lehigh Valley is a region defined not by ease, but by purpose. Every planting decision is guided by data, experience, and a commitment to cool-climate excellence. Lehigh Valley mirrors the growing conditions of northern European wine regions, offering a natural home for aromatic, textured whites and finely balanced reds.

Set between the Pocono foothills and the coastal plain is the Lehigh Valley Pennsylvania Viticulture Area (PVA), also recognized as an American Viticulture area (AVA). This is a region where vineyards climb southeast-facing slopes, and glacially deposited, rocky soils and steady drainage create an ideal foundation for terroir-driven winegrowing.

Sustainability is part of the region's DNA. Growers prioritize canopy balance, careful site selection, and minimal intervention, allowing the natural interplay of elevation, drainage, and diurnal shift to define the wines. With fewer extreme weather events than many northern or coastal regions, the Lehigh Valley has carved out a stable, reliable environment for consistent quality to become a premier growing area that now supplies a significant share of Pennsylvania's wine grapes.

This cool-climate viticulture region where European inspiration meets Pennsylvania ingenuity produces wines that reflect the landscape, heritage, and a belief in what deliberate winemaking can achieve.
