The Susquehanna Lowlands Pennsylvania Viticulture Area (PVA) is a landscape shaped by fog, sunlight, and the steady rise of new talent along the bends of the Susquehanna River. As the foggy mist lifts it reveals rolling hills that drain well, warm quickly, and open to generous southern exposures with an east-west ridge orientation that seems purpose-built for growing expressive, balanced wine grapes.

This is a region defined by contrasts and opportunity. The climate runs slightly warmer and longer than the Finger Lakes to the north, yet cooler than southeastern Pennsylvania, giving growers both ripeness and restraint to work with. Deep, fertile soils deliver reliable yields without compromising quality, year after year. It's a gift for winemakers looking to experiment, push boundaries, and craft wines that feel both rooted and forward-looking.

Cabernet Franc, Riesling, and hybrid varieties thrive here. Reds develop lift and supple texture, while whites gain clarity and sharpness. Across the hillsides, growers lean into sustainability, prioritizing soil health, canopy balance, and community stewardship.

With its blend of youthful energy and agricultural heritage, the Susquehanna Lowlands is an up-and-coming region fueled by curiosity.
