SHAPED BY HISTORY, CRAFTED IN THE VINEYARD

Set in the rolling hills touching Chester, Lancaster, and Delaware counties, the Brandywine wine region is steeped in heritage and driven by craft, a place where time-honored farming meets thoughtful innovation. The rocky, schist-rich soils and southeast-facing slopes have long shaped how grapes grow here, and today's winemakers carry that legacy forward with a focus on sustainability and respect for the land.

Cabernet Franc is the local star, producing everything from refreshing rosés to deeply layered reds that express the character of this Pennsylvania landscape. Petit Verdot shines on the rockier plots, adding bold flavor and texture. Cooler, flatter sites are being reimagined for méthode champenoise sparkling wines.

By working in tune with nature rather than against it, Brandywine's growers honor the past while crafting wines for the future. Each bottle reflects generations of care, a deep connection to the soil, and a shared belief that great wine begins with great stewardship.
